

Our teachers use <u>Google sites</u> to keep students and parents updated with curriculum guide information, additional assessment information as well as useful links to study sites and other important subject specific information. There is also information about signing up for the Parent Portal on the front page of the Google Site which is our communication method with you when reports are ready at the end of each data drop, twice each term.
