IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- We have been working with the Municipality and Ashghal to create a safety zone around the school for both students and stakeholders alike. VISUAL ACUITY TEST

The Visual Acuity Test among Year 1, 3 & 5 students is still ongoing. The program's main goal is to promote eye-health among students. The school clinic is an important part of early detection of low vision causes which will decrease the prevalence of blindness within this important age group. Once your child's visual acuity result is above 6/9, you will receive a "*Vision Screening Referral Letter*" for full eye examination.

FLU VACCINATION

The Ministry of Public Health (MoPH), along with Primary Health Care Corporation (PHCC) and Hamad Medical Corporation (HMC), is encouraging parents to ensure their young ones are vaccinated against flu, especially in those aged between six months and five years.
