

Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum

British Curriculum aimed supporting and developing the child's learning from Birth-KG2.



- Uses one handed tools and equipment, e.g. makes snips in paper
- Can copy some letters e.g. letters in their name
- Experiments with different ways of moving
- Can usually manage washing and drying hands
- Dresses with help, e.g. puts arms into open-fronted coat or shirt when held pulls trousers on etc.
- Beginning to be interested in and describe the texture of things
 Engages in imaginative role-play based on own first-hand experience
 Builds stories around toys e.g. farm animals needing rescuing from an armchair 'cliff'

- EYFS standards for each term. The seven areas Literacy (L), Math (M), Communication and Language (CL), Physical Development (PD), Expressive Art and Design (EAD), Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED) Understanding of the World (UW)
- Arabic and Islamic standards
- The teacher's comments on the student's progress.

The student is able to hold the paper and cut along a line on the paper without assistance.



Example of Developing-DE

Developing - DE

Your child's understanding is developing and he/she is working towards meeting expectations. He/she requires support with the understanding of key concepts, processes and cognitive skills.

EYFS Physical Development (Fine Motor) Standard:

Handles tools, objects, construction and malleable materials safely and with increasing control

The student needs support to cut the paper on or near the line. He is not able to hold the paper with one hand and manipulate the scissors with the other hand.



Example of Developing-DE

Developing - DE

Your child's understanding is developing and he/she is working towards meeting expectations. He/she requires support with the understanding of key concepts, processes and cognitive skills.

EYFS Literacy Standard:

Holds pencil near the point between first two fingers and thumb and uses it with good control.

The student seems confident when using crayons to draw his picture with a secure grip but the proper grip recommended in the standard is not yet observed.
